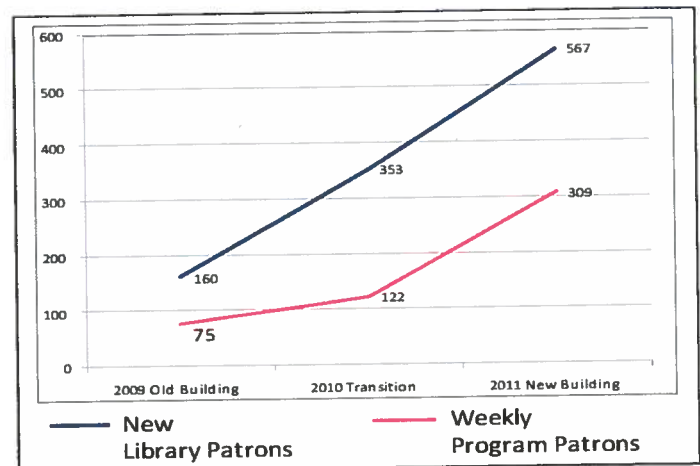
SHOUT it OUT!
