Hastings Highlands Parking Bylaw

The Municipality's Traffic, Parking, and Stopping Bylaw prohibits parking in these areas:

- On sidewalks, crosswalks, or pedestrian crossovers.
- Within intersections or fire routes.
- On bridges or their approaches.
- Within 3 metres of a fire hydrant or intersection.
- In a way that obstructs traffic or blocks other vehicles.
- That interferes with civic services like snow removal or road repairs.
- In front of driveways or blocking entrances.

https://www.hastingshighl ands.ca/living-here/bylawenforcement/parking/ Open-Air Fire Bylaw: As we head into warmer months, remember these fire regulations: ○ Night Burning Only: April 1-October 31, from 7:00 PM to 7:00 AM.

Small campfires, no larger than 2 ft by 2 ft in diameter are allowed during the day unless a total fire ban is in effect.

Always check our website for fire bans.

Here are a few key things to check:

Exterior Maintenance: Repair any damaged siding, steps, or railings. Yard Cleanup: Remove leftover debris, fallen branches, and any litter. Eavestroughs & Roofs: Clear out gutters and inspect for damage. Fences & Sheds: Make sure they're stable and in good condition.

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Hastings Highlands regulates noise to help keep our community quiet and

tranquil and serene.
All unnecessary noise is prohibited
between 11:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. daily,
including:

- Persistent animal noises (barking or whining).
- Loud shouting or yelling.
- Vehicle noises (e.g., banging or squealing).
- Unmuffled construction equipment operation.

Building in Hastings Highlands

As of January 1, 2025, the Municipality of Hastings Highlands started using the Cloud Permit online system for all building permit applications.

Dog Bites: Prevention & Responsibility in Our Community ?

Dog bites can happen, even with friendly pets—responsible ownership helps prevent incidents before they start. Watch for warning signs like growling, stiff posture, or avoidance.

In the event of a dog attack, call police immediately.

Once the situation is safe, contact Hastings Prince Edward Public Health at hpeph.ca.

Prompt reporting helps keep everyone safe.

What the Bylaw Says

In Hastings Highlands, dog owners must keep pets under control. If a dog bites or attacks, the owner may face:

- Fines or charges under local or provincial legislation.
- Orders to muzzle or restrain the dog.
- Possible removal or further action if the dog is deemed dangerous.

Let's keep our community safe and dog-friendly! %

- Always ask before petting a dog.
- 😭 Avoid startling or running at dogs.
- Teach kids to interact safely with pets.
- Step away calmly if a dog seems nervous or aggressive.



Hastings Highlands has a bylaw to help keep the community safe by regulating exotic animal ownership.

This bylaw prohibits the possession, harbouring, or keeping of certain animals considered dangerous or unsuitable for residential areas, including:

- Non-human primates (e.g., lemurs, monkeys, apes).
- ② Crocodilians (e.g., crocodiles, alligators).
- ☑ Certain reptiles (e.g., reticulated pythons, boa constrictors, venomous snakes).
- And other specifically listed species.

This bylaw helps protect the community and supports animal welfare.

Fireworks Regulations: A Guide to Safe Celebrations

Hastings Highlands has a Fireworks Bylaw to ensure safe and considerate displays, minimizing disturbances and risks to residents and wildlife.

Permitted Days/Hours:

Fridays and Saturdays, 6 PM - 11 PM, from June 20th to Thanksgiving Monday, plus Victoria Day, Canada Day, Labour Day, and New Year's Eve.

Fire Ban Restrictions:

No fireworks during a total fire ban. Check the municipality's website for current ratings. hastingshighlands.ca

Prohibited Devices:

Flying lanterns are prohibited at all times.

Exemptions: Submit written requests to the Municipal Clerk for Council review.
